### **Cost Recovery**

In 2012 the Monroeville Police Department entered into an agreement with Cost Recovery Corporation. The goal of this project is to recover some of the Villages cost when their police department responds to motor vehicle accidents. Only those who are at fault are billed, then only nonresidents.

In 2012 Cost Recovery billed those individuals \$1,915 for services provided by the police department. \$820 has been collected so far.

#### **Norwalk Municipal Court-Fines**

In 2012 Norwalk Municipal Court collected approximately \$43,472 in traffic fines and \$5,556 in criminal fines.
