Monroeville Police Department 2019 Report



Message From the Chief

This marks the eighth year that I have had the privilege of serving as your Chief of Police. This year saw some unique challenges. I would have never guessed that our fleet of cruisers would be so decimated from accidents and mechanical failure. But we got through it all and we now boast a very fine fleet of cruisers.

Training has always been important, not only in developing new officers but also honing the skills of seasoned veterans. Officer Hanuscin successfully completed Core Investigator training which is advanced training that can eventually lead to being certified as a Master Investigator. In addition, he along with Officer Eggleston successfully completed the most recent block in Arrest, Search and Seizure.

Officer Meyer successfully completed Firearms Instructor Range Medical Practices, Street Drug Identification and Field Testing, Patrol Drug Operations, and Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement. All training was sponsored by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy. All this training has aided our officers in making several significant drug related arrests including Methamphetamines, Cocaine, LSD, and Marijuana.

In addition to the above training, all officers recertified on the BAC Verifier which conducts blood alcohol testing by breath as well as LEADS which is the state-run system to permit the search of driver and vehicle information.

Our part time staff has continued to be stable and an additional officer was added to our ranks. Travis Wyczalek was hired and if the name sounds familiar, he worked as a part time officer several years ago. He left to accept a full-time position with the security force at NASA. He is a welcome addition and comes to us with a great combination of skills and experience.

Incidents For 2019

In 2019 officers of the Monroeville Police Department responded to 2,984 incidents. This represents an increase of approximately 15% over 2018 when officers responded to approximately 2,581 incidents. A detail listing of those incidents is attached to this report.

Photo Enforcement

During 2019 approximately 4,107 notices of liability were sent out to motorists for speeding and red-light violations. This is an increase over 2018 when approximately 2,186 notices of liability were sent out. The average speed violation was approximately 13.93 miles per hour over the posted speed limit. The most flagrant speed violation was 29 miles per hour over the posted speed limit or 74 miles per hour in a posted 45 zone.

The average red-light violation was approximately 1.6 seconds. This means the light was red for 1.6 seconds when the vehicle crossed the stop bar prior to entering the intersection. The most flagrant violation was 31.9 seconds.

In order to be considered a red-light violation, the vehicle must have crossed the stop bar after the traffic light has turned red. The stop bar is the very wide white line that is located next to the crosswalk lines, furthest from the intersection. It is not considered a red-light violation if the vehicle is in the intersection when the light turns red. For example, a vehicle stopped in traffic, inside the intersection, to make a left turn would not be considered a red-light violation. Unless

there is signage prohibiting, vehicles are permitted to make a right turn on red provided they come to a complete stop first before proceeding safely with the turn.

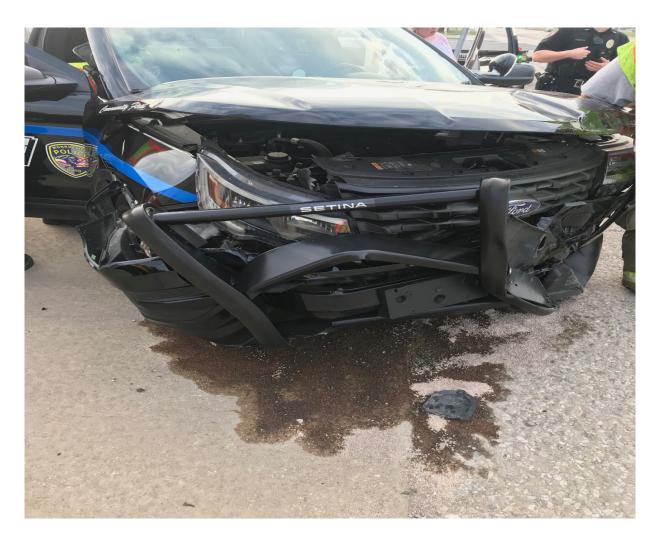
Speed violations are recorded when a vehicle reaches a speed of 12 mph or higher in a non-school zone area. In school zones a vehicle must be going 10mph or higher to receive a notice of liability.

Norwalk Municipal Court-Fines

In 2019 Norwalk Municipal Court assessed \$40,518 in traffic fines as compared to \$42,628 in 2018. \$10,697 in fines were assessed for criminal cases as compared to \$6,527 in 2018. Fines for Failure to File Village Income Tax are included in the criminal fine total.

Finally, 2019 saw the passing of a friend to me and the Monroeville Police Department. Former Mayor Sharon Miller passed away of natural causes. Sharon hired me as your Chief, and I will always be indebted to her for the opportunity she gave me and for the support she has shown the Monroeville Police Department throughout the years.
