
# Monroeville Police Department 2020 Report



### **Message From The Chief**

What a year. To say that 2020 presented challenges is an understatement. How do you prepare for a pandemic the likes of which we have not seen in over a century? Everyone's way of life changed dramatically and that was especially true for all police departments. Throughout the year we tried to serve our citizens while ensuring the safety of everyone from infection. We were truly fortunate as to date no full-time officers contracted Covid-19. However, two part time officers did contract the virus, but they recovered in several weeks with no ill effects. So far, vaccinations have not come available for police officers.

Even with all the restrictions of everyday activity, the Village was able to finish the construction of our new Municipal Complex. In September, the police department completed the move to our part of the facility, and we are steadily acclimating to this wonderful new home.

Training has always been important, not only in developing new officers but also honing the skills of seasoned veterans. As with many things this year, most training could not be conducted due to Covid-19 issues except for those areas that was mandated by the state such as recertification on the BAC Verifier which conducts blood alcohol testing by breath as well as LEADS which is the state-run system to permit the search of driver and vehicle information. Throughout the year we have steadily updated our policy and procedure manual in order to be in compliance with the most recent federal and state mandates.

Our part time staff has continued to be stable with no new officers added to our ranks.

As start this new year it is our hope that things will continue to improve. More people will get vaccinated, our economy will improve, and people will be able to go back to work, and our community will continue to grow and prosper.

#### **Incidents For 2020**

In 2020 officers of the Monroeville Police Department responded to 1,517 incidents. This represents a decrease of approximately 50.15% over 2019 when officers responded to approximately 3,043 incidents. This decline is linked to the implementation of Covid-19 protocols that required our officers to limit their contact with the public. Also, citizens were less mobile, staying home more often resulting in a 50% drop in reported vehicle accidents. A detail listing of those incidents is attached to this report.

#### **Photo Enforcement**

During 2020 approximately 1,840 notices of liability were sent out to motorists for speeding and red-light violations. This is a decrease compared to 2019 when approximately 4,107 notices of liability were sent out. The average speed violation was approximately 14.41 miles per hour over the posted speed limit. The most flagrant speed violation was 37 miles per hour over the posted speed limit or 62 miles per hour in a posted 25 zone.

The average red-light violation was approximately 2.37 seconds. This means the light was red for 2.37 seconds when the vehicle crossed the stop bar prior to entering the intersection. The most flagrant violation was 33.5 seconds.

In order to be considered a red-light violation, the vehicle must have crossed the stop bar after the traffic light has turned red. The stop bar is the very wide white line that is located next to

the crosswalk lines, furthest from the intersection. It is not considered a red-light violation if the vehicle is in the intersection when the light turns red. For example, a vehicle stopped in traffic, inside the intersection, to make a left turn would not be considered a red-light violation. Unless there is signage prohibiting, vehicles are permitted to make a right turn on red provided they come to a complete stop first before proceeding safely with the turn.

Speed violations are recorded when a vehicle reaches a speed of 12 mph or higher in a nonschool zone area. In school zones a vehicle must be going 10 mph or higher to receive a notice of liability.

#### **Norwalk Municipal Court-Fines**

In 2020 Norwalk Municipal Court assessed \$17,667 in traffic fines as compared to \$40,518 in 2019. In 2020 \$3,145 in fines were assessed for criminal cases as compared to \$10,697 in 2019. Fines for Failure to File Village Income Tax are included in the criminal fine total.

So far, the hybrid showing a significant savings in fuel costs for the Village.

# Community Outreach Programs


#### Hooked on Fishing.


